MoodleTwo is Coming...

Use of Moodle, the University's online learning management system, has reached almost 60% adoption rate by faculty. What does that mean? It means faculty members are turning on more sections of Moodle than ever before as they seek to spend more class



time on instruction. In ongoing efforts to improve the University's Moodle installation, a team of faculty began researching the benefits of migrating to Moodle 2.0 software in fall 2011. Based on their findings, three courses are being piloted in a MoodleTwo test site this spring. What's Next? Faculty interested in using Moodle 2.0 with their face-to-face, hybrid, or online courses this fall should email distancelearning@louisiana.edu for more information. The University Computing Support Services' Office of Moodle Support will make the **complete migration to MoodleTwo** for the **start of the spring 2013 semester**. Faculty will have use of the current Moodle site until December 31, 2012 and all materials will be retained on the site until December 31, 2013 allowing a full 12 months to move any information to the new site.

What Will Change? It is important to remember that **Moodle is Moodle**. The names and locations of some "activities" and "resources" have changed. You will be able to drag files from your desktop and drop them into Moodle. An interactive checklist feature will be available for faculty to create and students to complete as they work through the course's topics or weeks. But the core of the product and its structure will remain unchanged.




Image: Banner from MoodleTwo pilot course (SP12).

Quality Matters: New Online Training in 2012

This spring, the Office of Distance Learning's staff is now facilitating the national Quality Matters' foundation course: "Applying the Quality Matters Rubric". The online course focuses on the QM Rubric and its use in the design of online and hybrid courses. At the end of the course, participants will understand the principles of QM and the critical elements of the rubric, scoring system, and alignment. Participants also focus on their roles as peer reviewers.

How do I register?

Turn It In. UL Lafayette is piloting a plagiarism detection and online grading software called TurnItIn.com. **TurnItIn is now integrated within Moodle.** To create a TurnItIn assignment, simply select "TurnItIn Assignment" from the "Add an Activity" list. The access to instructions for using TurnItIn is provided on the main Moodle page in the "Information for Faculty" section.



Panopto. UL Lafayette is piloting Panopto, a lecture-capture software. With a webcam and Panopto recorder, you can record, edit, and distribute your lectures in a variety of formats (videos, podcasts, etc.). The end product catalogs your slides, building an index for students to navigate through.
